



# Alaska Schutzhund Club

## Basic Information & K9 Etiquette for Guests

The following contains information about *The Alaska Schutzhund Club* and answers to frequently asked questions by guests and prospective new members. We hope that this handout will answer your questions and provide insight into the sport of Schutzhund and our club.

Prospective members are evaluated to determine if we can help you and your dog be successful in Schutzhund and if you will harmoniously intermingle with our club. **If you do not attend group training, trials and seminars, and regularly train tracking and obedience, this is not the club for you. We do not train personal protection dogs,** our dogs are *motivated athletic working sport dogs*.

The Alaska Schutzhund Club is a non-profit Schutzhund oriented dog training organization affiliated with the United Schutzhund Clubs of America. We train both in Anchorage and the Mat-Su Valley. The club was founded by a small group of people who were interested in training and competing with their dogs in a mature, friendly and supportive environment.

We work together to achieve goals that we set for ourselves and our K9 partners. We celebrate the successes and try to laugh at our training mishaps together.

Our members are from all walks of life with varied occupations and other interests. We are all, however, students of the sport of Schutzhund, and always looking to improve our training methods and skills. We are serious about training our dogs, but emphasize having fun during training.

If you are not familiar with the sport it is important to know that Schutzhund is a fun and rewarding sport for you and your canine companion(s) but is very time consuming. **It takes time and dedication to train and succeed in all three phases of the sport: Tracking, Obedience, and Protection.** All members are required to participate in all three phases unless you are granted an exception by the Training Director and Board.

Training a dog from scratch to a Schutzhund 3 title can take 3-4 years depending on the amount of time dedicated to training, the skills of the handler, and the temperament and workability of the dog. Few dogs excel in all three phases of the sport without a fair amount of problem solving. The sport requires patience and sportsmanship. We expect our members to help and support one another with training issues. We expect everyone to pitch in with any tasks that need to be done such as clean-up, trial preparation and execution. We expect our members to treat their dogs fairly and respect other club members, trainers and judges. Abusive training methods will not be tolerated.

We will make an honest assessment of your dog during the invitational sessions and tell you whether your dog is suited for the sport. Protection work is not for dogs with weak nerves or dogs with very low drive. This does not mean that you have a bad dog, it just means that he/she is not suitable for this activity.

Since membership is limited, we prefer to keep the membership slots open to dog handlers that are serious about setting goals and achieving Schutzhund titles. The membership as a whole invests a lot of time and energy helping one another succeed in obtaining various level Schutzhund titles that range in difficulty from a beginning title of BH to the highest level of difficulty - Schutzhund 3.

**We welcome guests and prospective members to visit the training sessions of our club. There are some basic rules and canine etiquette that guests or prospective members need to be aware of. These need to be followed as safety of the canines and handlers is a primary concern. There is a \$10.00 per session fee for any non-members. There will also be a limited number of per sessions training to be determined by the Training Director and Board.**

**IMPORTANT - Please read in full. You will be required to sign an acknowledgement of receipt and acceptance, and a liability release on your first visit.**

- Initially we ask that you to come ***without*** your dog to learn & listen.
- All dogs on premise are required to be CURRENT on ALL VACCINATIONS. You the handler/owner may be required to provide proof of vaccination status, so make sure you have vet records available.
- You, the handler/owner, are required to keep your dog confined to a secure dog crate/kennel while the dog is not being trained. Dogs are not to be on the training field until it is your turn to work your dog. Dogs **MUST** be crated when not working on the field or during breaks in designated areas. **This rule is not optional and you will be asked to leave the field if you show up with the dog uncrated.**
- You the handler/owner can let your dog out to relieve him/her self, as long as the dog is under proper restraint and under control at all times. Dog(s) must use the designated area (NO relieving dogs on or near the training field). You the handler/owner are responsible for cleaning up any and all waste left by your dog(s).
- Dogs **MUST** be on leash and under control at all times except when in a training situation that warrants off leash work. Handlers **MUST** have a leash with them at all times. Dogs must have collars on at all times. Dogs must be under the control of their handlers at all times or you will be asked to leave.
- Safety is our number one priority. Do not approach any dogs without the handler's permission. Under no circumstances will you allow your dog to approach another dog without a specific request from a handler.
- Clean up after yourself, pickup cigarette butts, clean up after your dog, etc. No exceptions! If you smoke, please smoke away from any other people and dogs.
- Please go to senior members for any questions, the senior members have been in the club for several years and many have been competing in Schutzhund for many years prior to joining the club. If you do not know who they are, please ask and you will be directed to them.
- Ensure that you have water for your canine and yourself. Bring your own dog gear, folding chair, sunscreen, jackets, treat bags, rainwear, and bug spray. Have water on hand for yourself and your dog
- New people, especially novice dog handlers, are time consuming for our training director and helpers. In return for our help, we need your help! ***We expect everyone to show up on time, learn, listen and HELP OUT!***
- When training is being conducted you should be out on the field watching, listening, and paying attention, unless otherwise directed. This includes all three phases, obedience, tracking and protection. Quite often you will pick up more information by watching and listening to other people train, instead of sitting/standing around and chatting.

- Be a polite learner; do not stand/sit and privately chatter when there is work to be done by helping others.
- Understand that this is group training and during training sessions club members may offer advice to you. If you prefer not to be given advice while you are actively training, please let the members know to speak with you after your session. This will encourage respect, support and encouragement by and for all members.
- If you are loaned anything, it is for a session and **NOT** a gift unless otherwise stated. The item must be returned prior to the end of that day's session. ***Any sleeve, harness, collar, long line, leash, etc. must be returned immediately after you complete your turn.***
- When you arrive, be prepared to train immediately. Our training sessions are limited and when individuals arrive late, or not prepared to train, it detracts from everyone else's training time. Training time is just that, it is **not** time to groom, exercise, play, visit, etc.
- Our training is for our Schutzhund dogs. If you have other pet dogs, this is not the place for them. Please leave any pets at home.
- The lock combination is for members only. If a member gives you the combination, it is your responsibility to ensure that once you enter, the gate must be closed and relocked. Under no circumstances are you to give the combination to anyone else without permission from the Training Director or Board member. The Hundeplatz is for training and access should only be used for training.
- Bear in mind that this is a club effort, and not individual lessons. You are required to be working toward a title. If you are just looking to train your dog, you may want to look elsewhere. **You may be required to obtain a BH for your dog prior to moving on to training in protection. This decision will be made by the Training Director and Board.**
- Tracking is very specific and you are required to be present for the tracking sessions and on the field.
- Our club has set training times and you are responsible for being on time. Showing up late to just participate in protection will not be allowed.
- The club will assign mentors for new handlers/members.
- Wear comfortable clothes that you don't mind getting dirty. Pockets are useful. Shoes must be closed-toed and have good traction. Sandals are not allowed during training sessions.
- No dog being worked in the Club may be used for breeding unless it has been determined free of hip dysplasia (OFA, "A" stamp, or comparable certification).

- Much of our communication is done via e-mail, using our club discussion list on Yahoo.com. Only members have access to the Yahoo list. Until you are a member you will be copied on email relating to when and where training will be held.
- Tracking and obedience is every bit as important as protection. We will **not** train a dog in only one or two phases of Schutzhund; you must attend and participate in all three phases of the training. In order for you to progress, you must train on your own at home. The training director will let you know what you should be practicing and it is up to you to do it.
- You will be required to maintain a training log, at the very least a tracking log, and make it available to the Training Director upon request. If you are not sure how to set up a training log, your mentor will show you how to create and maintain one.
- For training sessions, you are required to help with things such as field setup, teardown, and cleanup. The field is setup the same way every time, take the initiative to jump in and help. If you are not sure what to do, ask for guidance.
- Club events require a lot of participation to organize and setup. If you have a special skill that will contribute to the organization, please volunteer. Getting the trial and field setup requires a lot of work and all participation is appreciated.
- Poor sportsmanship and any conduct which may be offense to club members, or derogatory to the club itself will not be tolerated.
- To keep training, and be voted in as an affiliate member, we will be watching for three things:
  - You must attend a minimum of 70% of the training sessions and you must train in all phases.
  - Prospective clients/members must show initiative and willingness to work during training sessions, trials and events.
  - The dog/handler team must show progress towards titles and the overall understanding of Schutzhund training theories and practices.
- The \$10.00 session fee is to be paid at the time of each visit unless other arrangements are made by the Treasurer or Board.

## WAIVER / INDEMNITY

### Release & Assumption of Risk Waiver

I, (Name) \_\_\_\_\_ am voluntarily and individually participating in Schutzhund dog training and other activities hosted by the ALASKA SCHUTZHUND CLUB, hereinafter referred to as 'ASC'. As a voluntary participant, I assume full responsibility of traveling and participating in any event or associated activity hosted by ASC; and I agree that ASC, including its members, officers, helpers, volunteers and any property owners associated with this activity are not, and shall not, be liable for any accident, injury, personal loss, or property damage incurred to me or by me, my heirs, assigns, or beneficiaries in connection with ASC.

I understand there are certain risks and dangers associated with and directly relating to participating in any activity, including (but not limited to): acts of God, natural disasters, forces of nature, wild and/or trained/controlled animals, other participants or people, various modes of traveling or transportation (including hiking and walking), terrain or any areas used for dog training/activities and other related conditions and circumstances.

I hereby irrevocably waive any and all claims for liability against the ASC as a result of my, my family members and any guest I may bring, voluntary participation in Schutzhund dog training and related activities. I fully and clearly understand and acknowledge that agreeing to this "WAIVER/INDEMNITY -- Release & Assumption of Risk Waiver" is a prerequisite and condition to participating in or taking part of any and all Schutzhund dog training/activities or events. Refusal to sign this waiver automatically prohibits said person from Schutzhund dog training/activities.

I understand that I am fully responsible for the actions of my dog. I agree to keep my dog properly restrained and under reasonable control between and during practice exercises. I agree to this "WAIVER/INDEMNITY -- Release & Assumption of Risk Waiver" and personally assume all responsibility and liability for my dog and myself and hold harmless all other parties from any claim for loss or injury.
